MSPB EMPLOYEES IN NATIONAL CAPITAL AREA WIN CFC PRESIDENT'S AWARD

Employees in the National Capital Area offices of the Merit Systems Protection Board (MSPB) have been honored with the President's Award for their outstanding participation in the 2004 Combined Federal Campaign (CFC). The award recognizes the efforts of the 133 employees in the Board's Washington, DC, headquarters and the Washington Regional Office (WRO), located in Alexandria, Virginia.

The MSPB employees qualified for the President's Award with a per capital gift of \$370 and far exceeded their contribution goal of \$34,000, contributing a total of \$49,263. MSPB employees also qualified for the Summit Award, achieving a 8% increase in giving over the previous year's results.

Nick Ngo and Patricia Brooks, members of the Office of Information Resources Management (IRM) at Board headquarters, were the Campaign Chair and Campaign Manager of the 2004 CFC campaign for MSPB's National Capital Area offices.

"This award recognizes the generosity and community involvement of MSPB employees," said Tommy Hwang, MSPB's CIO and IRM Director. "Considering the small number of our local agency employees and the number of agencies participating in the CFC's National Capital Area, the MSPB employees' efforts are remarkable. Through their contributions, MSPB employees have helped to transform lives for some, save lives for others, and improve the quality of life for all of us. I extend my appreciation and congratulations to our employees, as well as to our CFC key workers in the 2004 campaign at MSPB."
