#### **COURT DECISIONS**

##### **NONPRECEDENTIAL:**

*Jarmin v. Office of Personnel Management*, [No. 2017-1088](#) (Mar. 9, 2017) (MSPB Docket No. SF-0831-16-0161-I-1) (dismissing the petitioner's appeal of the Board's decision to deny his request for service credit under the Civil Service Retirement Act for lack of jurisdiction because it was untimely filed after the 60-day statutory period for appeal to the court).

*Wilborn v. Merit Systems Protection Board*, [No. 2016-2533](#) (Mar. 9, 2017) (MSPB Docket No. SF-0752-16-0033-I-1) (affirming the Board's dismissal for lack of jurisdiction because the appellant failed to nonfrivolously allege that his retirement was involuntary or that the Board had jurisdiction over the appeal as an Individual Right of Action appeal or an appeal under the Uniformed Services Employment and Reemployment Rights Act of 1994).

*Lamb v. Office of Personnel Management*, [No. 2016-2161](#) (Mar. 7, 2017) (MSPB Docket No. SF-844E-15-0348-I-1) (affirming the Board's decision to uphold OPM's denial of the appellant's application for disability retirement; the petitioner challenged the factual underpinnings of the Board's decision, which the court is precluded from addressing in a disability retirement appeal).
