NONPRECEDENTIAL:

Wallace v. Department of the Army, [No. 2016-2295](#) (May 3, 2017) (affirming the Board's decision that upheld the appellant's 6-day furlough because substantial evidence supported the Board's finding that it was taken for such cause as to promote the efficiency of the service, and rejecting the appellant's argument that he should have been exempt from furlough because, although his position had a military unit identification code, the majority of the work he performed in 2012 and 2013 was on civil works projects).
