NONPRECEDENTIAL COURT DECISION

In re Webb, No. [2020-100](#) (Fed. Cir. Oct. 23, 2019) (MSPB Docket No. DC-3443-18-0299-I-1): The court denied the petitioner's petition for a writ of mandamus, which sought: (1) to compel the Board to commence an investigation, and (2) the reversal of the court's dismissal of his petition for judicial review as premature because a petition for Board review was still pending. In denying the writ, the court reasoned that the petitioner had alternative means available to obtain relief, specifically, continuing to seek Board review or seeking to withdraw his petition for review with the Board and filing a petition for review with the court.
