SEPARATE OPINION OF CHAIRMAN DANIEL R. LEVINSON,  
CONCURRING IN RESULT

I concur that the appellant is not entitled to an award of attorney fees, but for reasons apart from those upon which the Administrative Judge relied. For the reasons set forth in my dissenting opinion in Stephens v. Office of Personnel Management, 33 M.S.P.R. 292, 303 (Levinson, dissenting) (1987), I do not believe that the Board should consider the appellant's application for attorney fees.
